PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Authority: 49 U.S.C. Title 114, 44936 authorized the collection of this information.

Purpose: The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will use the biographical information to conduct a security threat assessment to evaluate your eligibility for the program to which you are applying. Your fingerprints and associated information/biometrics will be provided to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for the purpose of comparing your fingerprints to other fingerprints in the FBI's Next Generation Identification (NGI) system or its successor systems (including civil, criminal, and latent fingerprint repositories). The FBI may retain your fingerprints and associated information/biometrics in NGI after the completion of this application and, while retained, your fingerprints may continue to be compared against the other fingerprints submitted to or retained by NGI. DHS will also transmit the fingerprints for enrollment into the US-VISIT's Automated Biometrics Identification System (IDENT). If you provide your Social Security Number (SSN), DHS may provide your name and SSN to the Social Security Administration (SSA) to compare that information against SSA's records to ensure the validity of your name and SSN.

Routine Uses: The information may be shared with third parties during the course of a security threat assessment, employment investigation, or adjudication of a waiver or appeal request to the extent necessary to obtain information pertinent to the assessment, investigation, or adjudication of your application or in accordance with the routine uses identified in the Transportation Security Threat Assessment System (T-STAS), DHS/TSA 002. For as long as your fingerprints and associated information/biometrics are retained in NGI, your information may be disclosed pursuant to your consent or without your consent as permitted by the Privacy Act of 1974 and all applicable Routine Uses as may be published at any time in the Federal Register, including the Routine Uses for the NGI system and the FBI's Blanket Routine Uses.

Vehicle Access & Ramp Driving Privileges

The Air Operations Area (AOA) is defined as the area (paved and unpaved) within the airport perimeter fencing inclusive of the runway, taxiway, ramps, hangars, parking aprons, aircraft parking or tie down areas, and dirt mediums

Issuance of an AOA Vehicle Access Card

Individuals eligible for an AOA Vehicle Access card are:

- Own a hangar
- Own an aircraft based at the airport
- Work at the airport and require access to the AOA for your job duties
- Have a contract with or provide services for the airport which require access to the AOA
- Provide public safety services (police, fire, etc.)
- Have current insurance on their automobile.

AOA Driving Privileges

It is the responsibility of all persons issued an AOA Vehicle Access Card to know the applicable rules.

- Every person wishing to operate a vehicle on the AOA shall obtain the approval of the Airport Director and/or the Airport Security Coordinator prior to operating a vehicle on the AOA
- Do not allow another car to follow you through the gate (“piggyback”) or use your card to allow another vehicle to enter the AOA
- Do not hinder or obstruct the movement of aircraft
- Yield the right of way to aircraft at all times
- Report any accident involving a vehicle to the Airport Director or Airport Security coordinator
- Report unauthorized vehicles on the AOA to the Airport Director or Airport Security Coordinator
- Drive at 5 MPH in aircraft movement areas
- Do not drive between aircraft
- Do not park within 20 feet of an aircraft
- Do not park or leave vehicles unattended on any portion of the AOA
- Unattended vehicles are subject to search by Airport staff
- Unattended vehicles will be towed at the owners expense
- The Airport is not liable for damages to vehicles removed from the AOA
- All vehicles driving on the ramp must be insured
- Report unattended vehicles on the AOA to the Airport Director or Airport Security Coordinator
- Non-compliance will result in revocation of AOA driving privileges and cancellation of AOA Vehicle Access Card

AOA Escort Rules

It is the responsibility of individuals issued an Identification Badge to know the following:

- The Air Operations Area (AOA) is defined as the area (paved and unpaved) within the airport perimeter fencing inclusive of the runway, taxiway, ramps, hangars, parking aprons, aircraft parking or tie down areas, and dirt mediums
- The Secure Area is immediately in front of the commercial terminal and separated from the general aviation ramp by a double red line. The baggage make-up area is also part of the Secure Area.
- The Sterile Area is the holding room inside of the terminal building.
- Accompany your visitor(s) at all times.
- Escort only as many visitors as may be properly controlled.
- Be able to see your visitor(s) at all times.
- Insure that your visitor(s) can hear any instructions given to them at all times.
- Keep your visitor(s) in close proximity and under your control at all times.
- Only let the visitor go where you are allowed access.
- If you are driving on the ramp you must be in the same vehicle as your visitor.
- Visitors found on the AOA without proper escort will be asked to leave.
- Airport staff will contact law enforcement if they suspect criminal activity or require assistance.
- If required law enforcement can be summoned by dialing "9-1-1" or contacting Airport staff at 760-934-3813.

Challenge Procedures

It is the responsibility of individuals issued a Mammoth Yosemite Airport Identification Badge to know the following:

- The Air Operations Area (AOA) is defined as the area (paved and unpaved) within the airport perimeter fencing inclusive of the runway, taxiway, ramps, hangars, parking aprons, aircraft parking or tie down areas, and dirt mediums.
- The Secure Area is defined as the baggage make-up area and the area immediately in front of the commercial terminal building demarked by a double red line.
- The Sterile Area is defined as the holding room in the terminal building.
- To “challenge” an individual on the AOA or Secure Area is to ask an individual to produce their ID Badge and determine their authority to be present on the AOA or Secure Area.
- All individuals issued an ID Badge must be familiar with and practice challenge procedures.
- Immediately report to Airport staff any individual in the Secure Area who not displaying a valid Secure Area ID Badge.
- Immediately report to Airport Staff any individual in the AOA who cannot produce an ID badge upon request.
- Any Airport ID Badge found to be expired altered, or not matching the suspect individual will be confiscated by Airport staff and that person asked to leave the Secure Area.
- Airport ID Badge holders are required to challenge and/or report persons who may be exhibiting suspicious behavior.
- You cannot escort individuals into the Secure Area who have been issued and ID badge but are not in possession of it.
- Airport staff will investigate all unidentified persons, unidentified vehicles, persons unable to produce an ID Badge, or suspicious activity within the Secure Area or the AOA. Airport staff can be contacted by calling 760-934-3813.
- If you suspect criminal activity or require assistance contact Airport Staff who will summon law enforcement. Or, if warranted, you may contact law enforcement directly by dialing 9-1-1.
- All aviation workers should be aware of possible “insider threats” and report any suspicious behavior of other aviation workers.
- Airport staff will report to TSA those incidents involving actions taken in connection with 49 CFR Part 1542 requirements for investigation and possible civil penalty action which involved the Secure Area or AOA.
- All aviation workers understand that they are subject to random searches of any items they bring into the Secure or Sterile Areas including backpacks.
- Aviation workers, even with the proper security badge, should be “Challenged” by you if you have any suspicions that they seem out of place or are acting suspiciously.

**MAMMOTH YOSEMITE AIRPORT
ANNUAL TRAINING DOCUMENTATION
SIDA / SECURED AREA / AOA**

Review of these procedures will ensure that you are properly trained in MMH procedures for the Security Identification Display Area (SIDA) and Secured Area and AOA.

1. "SIDA" stands for "Security Identification Display Area".
2. AOA stands for Air Operations Area – which is all property within the airport perimeter excluding the SIDA.
3. At MMH the "Secured Area" includes the luggage inspection area and the delineated ramp area in front of the commercial terminal. Only individuals wearing SIDA ID badges should be allowed into this area.
4. At MMH the SIDA and Secured Area are the same.
5. If a person is not wearing a SIDA badge in the Secure Area he should be "Challenged" – interdicted and asked to display their badge or be turned away from the Secured Area.
6. If a person comes to work with out their SIDA badge they cannot be escorted into the Secured Area. They should be reported immediately to the Airport Security Coordinator or your supervisor.
7. Individuals who do not work at the airport and do not have MMH airport ID badges can be "escorted" into the Secured Area by individuals with MMH SIDA ID airport badges who have be given "Escort" privileges by the Airport Security Coordinator.
8. All persons who receive SIDA (Secure Area) badges have undergone a Criminal History Records Check (CHRC) and a Security Threat Analysis (STA).
9. All persons who receive an AOA badge have undergone a STA.
10. AOA badges must be in the possession of the person to which they were issued when they enter the AOA.
11. At MMH the Secured Area is maintained continuously.
12. Individuals with MMH airport ID badges (SIDA & AOA) undergo a Security Threat Analysis (STA) on a monthly basis.
13. If you lose your badge it must be reported immediately to the Airport Office, Airport Manager, or Airport Security Coordinator.
14. All aviation workers understand that they are subject to random searches of any items they bring into the Secure or Sterile areas including backpacks.
15. All aviation workers should be aware of possible "insider threats" and report any suspicious behavior of other aviation workers.
16. Aviation workers, even with the proper security badge, should be "Challenged" by you if you have any suspicions that they seem out of place or are acting suspiciously.
